The event is intended to create a platform for networking and mutual learning for Ukrainian researchers based in Germany, offering networking opportunities within and beyond academic disciplines as well as in-depth discussions on topics relating to the current situation of higher education and research in Ukraine. Going beyond institutional and disciplinary borders, it will also focus on strengthening ties between researchers based in Ukraine and in Germany, bringing in selected participants based in Ukraine via hybrid participation, in addition to online-streaming.

The event is jointly convened by the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation, DAAD – German Academic Exchange Service, Deutsche Bundesstiftung Umwelt, Gerda Henkel Foundation, Leopoldina – German National Academy of Sciences, and VolkswagenStiftung. It is by invitation only and will be conducted in English.



During a series of HUMBOLDT4UKRAINE events (October-November 2023), researchers and experts from Ukraine and more than 20 other countries discussed support measures for now and after the war. As part of the Science at Risk project (https://scienceatrisk.org/), 30 Ukrainian scientists worked for 9 months in expert working groups, analysing the situation in the country and looking for ways to solve urgent and long-term problems that have arisen as a result of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. The experience of Ukrainian scientists in the preservation of scientific works, collections, and institutions formed the basis of nine white papers.
